- Inadequate sanitation facilities and the practice of open defecation contribute to the spread of waterborne diseases such as diarrhea, cholera, and typhoid.
- Improper disposal of human waste can lead to environmental pollution, contamination of water sources, and ecological challenges.
- Sanitation crisis can have economic consequences as well.

Importance of Toilets

- Toilets are given importance as it is a foundation stone of public health and play a critical role in protecting the environment.
