

COMPREHENSIVE ACTION PLAN FOR PHASING OUT SINGLE USE PLASTIC



GOVERNMENT OF NAGALAND

INTRODUCTION

In line with the clarion call given by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi to phase out single use plastic by 2022, keeping in view the adverse impacts of littered plastic on both terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India, has notified the Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules, 2021 on 12th August, 2021 [vide No. G.S.R.571(E)], which prohibits identified single use plastic items which have low utility and high littering potential by 01 July, 2022.

Pollution due to single use plastic items has become an important environmental challenge confronting all countries. India is committed to take action for mitigation of pollution caused by littered Single Use Plastics. In the 4th United Nations Environment Assembly held in 2019, India had piloted a resolution on addressing single-use plastic products pollution, recognizing the urgent need for the global community to focus on this very important issue.

The manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale and use of following single-use plastic, including polystyrene and expanded polystyrene, commodities shall be prohibited with effect from the 1st July, 2022 as per the Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rule, 2021.

- a) Plastic carry bags less than seventy-five (75) microns in thickness with effect from the 30thSeptember, 2021 and carry bags less than one hundred and twenty (120) microns in thickness with effect from the 31st December, 2022.
- b) Ear buds with plastic sticks, plastic sticks for balloons, plastic flags, candy sticks, ice-cream sticks, polystyrene [Thermocol] for decoration;
- c) Plates, cups, glasses, cutlery such as forks, spoons, knives, straw, trays, wrapping or packing films around sweet boxes, invitation cards, and cigarette packets, plastic or PVC banners less than 100 micron, stirrers.

In order to stop littering the State Government vide notification no. UDD/7-GEN/07/PWM/2016 Dated Kohima 17th June, 2019 imposed a total ban on all Single Use Plastic in the state.

The plastic packaging waste, which is not covered under the phasing out of identified single use plastic items, shall be collected and managed in an environmentally sustainable way through the Extended Producer Responsibility of the Producer, Importer and Brand owner (PIBO), as per Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 (as amended to date). For effective implementation of Extended Producer Responsibility under the Guidelines for Extended Producer Responsibility being brought out have been given legal force through Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules, 2021.

The waste management infrastructure in the States/UTs is being strengthened through the Swachh Bharat Mission. The following steps have also been taken to strengthen implementation of Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 and also to reduce the use of identified single use plastic items.

OBJECTIVE:

- 1. To eliminate the prohibited identified Single Use Plastics (SUPs) from the State of Nagaland by 30thJune, 2022.
- 2. To enhance the production and usage of eco-friendly alternatives to the identified SUPs.
- 3. Establishment of proper mechanism for monitoring of collection and recycling of plastic waste.

ACTION POINT:

This Comprehensive Action Plan (CAP) has been formulated with the following components to make the State of Nagaland as Single Use Plastic Free State by July, 2022.

- 1. Extensive survey for identified Single Use Plastic waste generation.
- 2. Intensifying inspection & monitoring of manufacturer, stockiest and vendors of identified Single Use Plastic.
- 3. Intensifying inspection & monitoring of industries manufacturing plastic items.
- 4. Finding suitable alternatives for identified Single Use Plastic and ensuring uninterrupted "Supply Chain "through Self Help Groups and MSME sector.
- 5. Declaration of Educational Institutes and Government Department as identified SUP free campus.
- 6. Establishing Collection Centre under Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR).
- 7. Ensuring establishment of Collection Centre under Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR).
- 8. Establish proper plastic waste collection and scientific disposal system.
- 9. Working out modalities for monitoring and regulation of informal sectors engaged in collection and recycling of plastic waste
- 10. Information Education and Communication (IEC) activities for mass awareness.
- 11. The Core Committee entrusted to prepare CAP may be given the responsibility for monitoring the approved CAP.
- 12. It is proposed to ban packaged drinking water bottle less than 1 litre.

This Comprehensive Action Plan has been prepared taking into account the National Level outlook in order to maintain the uniformity by encompassing the Ten (10) Thematic Areas and Forty Eight (48) actionable activities for elimination of Single Use Plastic (SUP) and effective waste management and state specific issues to tackle comprehensively the rampant use of plastic in the state.
